be and (2) Whether the proceedings of Labour Courts and Tribunals should be excluded from the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court and/or of the High Courts in the matter of appeals and applications for writs. A decision will be taken after considering the replies received.

SALT FOR MYSORE

\*1917. Shri Madiah Gowda: Will the Minister of Production be pleased to state:
