overall increase in the size of the railway and police establishment.

Shri P. Subba Rac: Does not the Government think that by prosecuting these beggars, the nuisance will be brougnt under control?

Shri Alagesan: No.

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: They will get food in the jails;

shrl P. Subba Rao: Simply being turned out is no good.

Mr, Deputy-Speaker: It is a matter of opinion.

Shri Ponsoose: Are these beggars allowed a place in the Five-Year Plan?

Shri Ragbavaiah: May I know whether the Railway Miniatry is contemplating liquidat og the beggar nulsance in träins in the course of the Five-Year Plan?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: It is an all India problem. It is for the States to tackle it.

Sardar A. S. Salgal: Is it a fact that beggars with leproxy are inavelling in the Eastern Rallway Zone Iron Blanpur to Katni and Bilaspur to Characharpur and take rice and smuggle them into ather provinces?

Skri Alagenan: With the change in the food policy, smugging has very much decreased in all areas.

Shri M. L. Dwivedi: As a large part of the stealing is done by small children who are encouraged in Veg on the platforms, what steps are being taked to prevent them from doing so?

Shri Alagman: As soon as they ara found, they are taken out,

Shri Reghavalah: May I know whether the number of beggars is increasing or decreasing?

Mr. Deputy-Speaker: That has been answered in the first part of the ouestion. Apart from the Question Hour being over, the Question List is also over. There are three short notice ouestions. The first one is by Shri Kanavade Patil, relating to food scarcity in Maharashtra.
