SURVEY OF CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES

*1179. Shri Janani: Will the Minister of Raliways be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Rallway Board have appointed a special officer to undertake a special survey with a view to encourage and promote the organisation of the cooperative societies amongst the Rallway workers:

- (b) If so, whether any plan has been submitted by the special officer;
- (c) whether Government propose to place a copy of the Plan on the Table of the House; and
- (d) what steps have so far been taken by the Railway authorities for the implementation of this plan?

The Deputy Minister of Rali-ways and Transport (Sbrl Alagesan): (a) Yes.

(b), (c) and (d). The officer has submitted a report which is under examination by Government.

Shri Jasanl: May I know for what type of co-operative societies the survery was made-multi-purpose, credit societies, consumers or industrial?

Shri Alagesan: The survey has been made by the officer concerned, and he has submitted a detailed report. His recommendations are now under *xamination by the Government. It was with reference to multipurpose societies and co-operative wholesale stores, etc.

Shri B. S. Murthy: When was the report submitted and how long do Government propose to take in order to implement the recommendations contained in the report?

Shrl Alagesan: The report was submitted some time back. The Government may take some time in arriving at their conclusions.

MESSAGE RATE SYSTEM
