The Deputy Minister of Finance (Shri M. C. Shah): The information asked for is not available. The Insurance Year Book contains figures of percentages of lapses (in sums insured) in respect of new business of each calendar year according to duration of policies, but the latest information published is in respect of 1952.

Dr. M. M. Das: I think and speak subject to correction that the report has been recently received.
