- (b) if so, the number of such displaced persons to be rehabilitated in the Eastern States, State-wise; and
- (c) the other facilities that Government propose to give them for their economic stability?

The Deputy Minister of Rehabilitation (Shri J. K. Bhonsle): (a) Yes.

- (b) Since the influx is continuing, it is not possible to have a correct assessment.
- (c) In addition to assistance in the shape of agricultural land and loans for settlement in business or for the construction of houses, Covernment gives financial assistance for the education of their children and vocational training to enable them to earn their livelihood. Employment is found for them in Government and private concerns and attempts are being made to start cottage, medium and large-scale industries in order to enable them to find gainful employment.
