ORAL ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS SUGAR

*2658. Shri Sarangadhar Das: Will the Minister of Food and Agriculture be pleased to lay a statement on the Table of the House showing:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the production of sugar during 1954-55 is expected to be 40 per cent. higher than that in 1953-54;
- (b) whether the off-take from the sugar factories during the current season has shown a downward tendency and if so, by how much;
- (c) the total stocks held by the factories as well as Government on the 31st March, 1955;
- (d) the total quantity of sugar Government have already purchased in foreign countries, but which is yet to arrive in India; and
- (e) the quantity proposed to he purchased by Government during 1955-56?

The Minister of Agriculture (Dr. P. S. Deshmukh): (a) to (e). A statement giving the required information is laid on the Table of the Sabha [See Appendix XII, annexure No. 49].

Shri S. N. Das: May I know whether there is any increase in acreage?

Dr. P. S. Deshmukh: I am proud to say that without hardly any addition to the acreage last year, we 107 LSD.

are likely to produce more than 15 lakh tons of sugar this year as compared to 10 lakh tons last year.

Shri S. N. Das: In view of the increased production, may I know whether the Government propose to stop the import of sugar?

Dr. P. S. Deshmukh: Yes. Sir. Excepting where we are committed already we do not propose to import.

Shri Sarangadhar Das: If the Government's contention all along during the last one year or so was that the capita consumption of per crystal sugar is going up, how is it that the offtake is very much less than last year from the factories?

Dr. P. S. Deshmukh: This convention of sugar is a very tricky affair, because just as the prices between gwr and sugar vary, the consumption also varies. Therefore, I do not trust the figures that I get so far as consumption of sugar is concerned. There are many gaps and many difficulties in between.

Will Government Shri Nevatia: agree to cancel or delay the despatch of imported sugar so that the prices may be maintained at a reasonable level?

Dr. P. S. Deshmukh: We are prepared to do it as far as possible.
