Secretariat Appointments

The Deputy Minister of Home Affairs (Shri Datar): (a) and (b). It is not clear what is referred to as direct appointments being rejected by the Union Public Service Commission. Direct appointments to Class I and Class II Services, except in cases specifically excluded from the purview of the Union Public Service Commission, have to be made in consultation with the Commission unless the appointments are such that they are not likely to last for more than one year. As, however, Union Public Service Commission selection, after dua advertisement, naturally takes sometime, it often becomes necessary to make provisional appointments to carry on the work in hand. Such appointments are made on the clear understanding that persons so appointed will have to vacate unless they are themselves selected by the Union Public Service Commission, as soon as the Commission's nominees are ready to join the post. These instances do not amount to appointments made by Govern
