Steel

*884. Shri Gidwani: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Soviet Union has offered another one lakh tons of steel;
- (b) if so, what are the conditions under which the offer has been made; and
- (c) when steel will be actually supplied to India?

The Minister of Industries (Shri Kanungo): (a) Yes, Sir. Negotiations are taking place for import of additional quantities of steel.

(b) and (c). The terms and conditions of sale are still under negotiation.

Indians in Philippines

*885. Sardar Iqbal Singh: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to refer to the reply given to Starred Question No. 1449 on the 29th September, 1954 and state the total number of Indian Nationals who have acquired citizenship so far in Philippines since the promulgation of Philippines Immigration Act?

Export Promotion Councils

Steel

International Atomic Conference
