The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Production (Shri R.G. Debey): The recommendation of the Gur and Khandsari Sub-Committee has peen considered by the Board. Steps are being taken to survey the qualities in the market with a view to formulating standards. The Governments of Hydera-bad, Uttar Padesh, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh have been requested to organise Gur-grading stations.

The Board will take a final decision about fixing minimum standards after the preliminary investigations have been completed. In the meanwhile, the Board is endeavouring to popularise grades previously fixed by the Agricultural Margrades keting Adviser.

Textile Industry

- *1015. Shri Morarka: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

Bellampalli Coal Mines

- (a) whether Government are aware of the shortage of coal felt by local industries in Hyderabad State due to the strike in Bellampalli Coal Mines;
- (b) whether any representation was made in this respect by the Hydera-bad Chamber of Commerce to the Coal Commissioner; and
- (c) what arrangements are made to supply coal to the said industries so that their work is not hampered for want of coal owing to the strike?

The Deputy Minister of Production (Shri Satish Chandra): (a) Yes.

- (c) The strike was called off on the 28th November, 1955. During the period of the strike the Singareni Collieries were advised to allocate three wagons of coal per day specially to industries situated in Hyderabad State, holding poor stock, by ma-king corresponding reduction in allotment to other consumers in South India. The industries were also permitted to take supplies from alternative sources for which sanctions were given on ad hoc basis. So far as Government is aware, no factory in Hyderabad State had to close down or slow down production during the period of the strike for want of coal.

N. E. S. Blocks In Manipur
