The Minister of Industries (Shri Kanungo): (a) There has been no serious shortage of rayon yarn in the country. Some representations complaining of shortage have, however, been received from certain quarters.

#### Compensation to Displaced Persons

The Minister of Rehabilitation (Sari Mehr Chand Khanna) : (a) to (c). Of the 13954 compensation applications from widows registered upto July 1953, 12229 have been paid and 1725 remain to be paid. Out of the 6457 widows who applied subsequently upto 31st October, 1954, 3225 have been paid off and 3232 remain to be paid. Every effort is being made to pay off all the remaining cases of both categories as early as possible.
