(b) if so, the places where they have been opened and experience of their working?

The Deputy Minister of Planning (Shri S. N. Mishra): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) A Technical Training Centre was opened at Kotah (Rajasthan) with effect from 1-11-1955.

The candidates are being given intensive practical as well as theoretical training. So far the candidates have responded well to the opportunities provided.

## KASHMIR ISSUE

\*2190. Shri Gidwani: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state :

(a) whether the attention of Government has been drawn to a press statement made by Shri Ghazanfar Ali Khan, High Commissioner for Pakistan in India that Shri Nehru, Prime Minister of India has no objection to a meeting in the near future with the Pakistan Prime Minister to discuss the Kashmir issue; and
