श्री रघुनाथ सिंह: इसमें कितने भादमी घायल हुए भीर कितने भादमियों की हत्या हुई?

श्री सावत झली कां: १७ श्रीर १६ मार्च को फीरोजपुर जिले में, फीरोजपुर हडवक्सं के पास जो हादसा हुआ, उसमें हमारी सेना के चार श्रादमी मारे गये श्रीर २१ श्रादमी जरूमी हुए।

**Shri D. C. Sharma:** May I know how many times the air space has been violated during the very same period?

Shri Sadath Ali Khan: I am talking about the earth and not about air.

Shri D. C. Sharma: May I know what action Government has taken to prevent the recurrence of these border incidents?

The Deputy Minister of External Affairs (Shri Anil K. Chanda): This is a matter which has been referred to many times on the floor of this House. And, the Prime Minister, only a few days ago said that it is impossible to completely prevent a recurrence of incidents of this nature, considering the long border line involved. But, every possible effort is taken to prevent such incidents.

**दा** राम सुभग सिंह : क्या यह सही है कि कराची सम्मेलन के तुरंत पहले रन प्राफ कच्छ में जो पाकिस्तान की ग्रीर से हमला हुग्रा वा उसमें श्रमरीकन श्राम्सं (शस्त्र) इस्तेमाल किये गये थे, श्रीर क्या उसी से उत्साहित होकर उन्होंने बार बार उसके बाद हमला करना प्रारम्भ कर दिया?

भी सादत प्रली खां : इस सभा में पहले बतलाया जा चुका है कि ग्रमरीकन ग्राम्सं तो पाये नहीं गये । जो हथियार हमने उनसे पकड़े हैं उनमें कोई हथियार ग्रमरीका का बना हुग्रा नहीं है ।

भी एम० एल० द्विवेदी: मैं यह जानना चाहता हं कि क्या पाकिस्तान और हिन्दुस्तान के बीच मैं बाउंडरी (सीमा) को सैटिल (तय) करने के लिये, जिससे कि ऐसे हमले न हो सकें, कोई कमीशन बैठा है, और क्या पाकिस्तान भीर हिन्दुस्तान ने मिलकर कोई काम किया है, यदि हां तो इसमें भ्रव तक क्या तरक्की हई है? Shri Anil K. Chanda: The two Directors-General of Survey have met recently and they are having details worked out.

**Shri M. L. Dwivedi:** How much of the plan has been worked out.

**Shrimati Khongmen:** Are Government aware of similar violent attacks made by the Pakistanis on the eastern frontier; and if so, what is the number of such occasions?

Mr. Speaker: This question refers to West Pakistan.

Sardar Iqbal Singh: In view of the fact that according to the Pant-Mirza agreement some arms have been taken away from civilian population living in those areas, will Government consider the restoration of these arms?

Shri Sadath Ali Khan: I have no information that any arms have been taken away from civilian population.

Sardar Iqbal Singh: Will the hon. Parliamentary Secretary make enquiries and lay a statement on the Table of the House?

Shri Sadath Ali Khan: I shall make enquiries.

AGREEMENT WITH U. S. S. R.

\*1760. Dr. Ram Subhag Singh: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state the estimated value of the cottage industries products which the Soviet Union will buy under the recent trade agreement between India and U.S.S.R.

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Karmarkar): Presumably the hon. Member is referring to the joint Indo-Soviet Communique issued on December, 1955, which states, amongst other things that the U.S.S.R. would increase substantially her purchases from India. The Communique does not specify the commodities which the U.S.S.R. will buy from India or their quantity or value. We, however,

believe that the Soviet Trade Representation in India intends to make purchases of a substantial quantity of handicraft goods also.

Shri A. M. Thomas: May I enquire whether coir mats and mattings are included in the list?

Shri Karmarkar: I think, we should like to export every kind of article. I look forward to Russia buying some coir mats and mattings.

Shri B. S. Murthy: May I know whether the list includes lace goods also?

The Minister of Commerce and Industry and Iron and Steel (Shri T. T. Krishnamachari): I do not think so.

Mr. Speaker: Why not a list be placed on the Table of the House if the hon. Member wants to know the details of the manufacture in several States?

Shri Karmarkar: The list depends upon what they propose to buy from us.

Shri C. R. Chowdary: May I know whether any list has been prepared showing the articles which are surplus in our country and which are offered to them for their consideration so that they may say which of the articles they will be prepared to purchase?

Shri T. T. Krishnamachari: My hon. friend's suggestion is being actually carried out and I can also tell my hon. friend that the programme of purchases which I saw yesterday more or less completes the credit that they have now, that is to say, it equates the purchases that we have made from them. This is a matter which has to go on on the basis of mutual agreement. For the needs of the two countries, it is not possible for us to say that this particular article will be taken or that particular article will be taken.

## SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES

\*1763. Shri shree Narayan Das: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state the amount of expenditure incurred so

far by Government as partial payment of the additional staff employed by the State Governments in their Industries Departments to deal with Small Scale Industries?

The Minister of Industries (Shri Kanungo): Nil so far, as the State Governments have not yet sent us the statement of actual expenditure incurred by them during 1955-56 for the additional staff employed by them. On receipt of these statements, 50% of the expenditure would be sanctioned by the Central Government.

Shri Shree Narayan Das: May I know the names of the States which have so far agreed to participate in the scheme which has been drawn up by the Indian Government in this sphere?

Shri Kanungo: All of them have agreed.

Shrt Shree Narayan Das: May I know whether the Government of India is aware which of the States have so far appointed the District Magistrate as the Chief Development Officer in that district?

Shri Kanungo: We are not aware of the appointments by the State Governments of their own officers, but we will know the special officers appointed for this purpose only when we receive the statement from them.

Shri Shree Narayan Das: May I know the total amount that the Government of India will spend or require for the implementation of the scheme?

Shri Kanungo: We have offered 50 per cent of the cost of entertaining such staff; it will vary according to the different States.

## INDIAN GREEN TEA

\*1765. Shri Hem Raj: Will the Minister of Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Indian Green Tea is losing its markets in Afghanistan;
