Indian Institute of Technology, Kharsepur

Shri Subodh Hansda;
Shri S. C. Samanta;

Will the Minister of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that a Reviewing Committee has been appointed by the Government to review the working and development of the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur;
- (b) if so, how many members have been appointed on this Committee;
- (c) whether they have started their work; and
  - (d) if so, since when?

The Minister of Scientific Besearch and Cultural Affairs (Shri Humayun Kahir): (a) A Reviewing Committee was appointed by the President of India in his capacity as the Visitor of the Institute;

- (b) Five;
- (c) and (d). The Committee started work on the 12th January, 1989, \$4(Ai) L.S.D.—1.

and has submitted its report on 29th January, 1959.

Shri Subodh Haneda: Msy I know whether this is the first time that such a Reviewing Committee has been appointed?

Shri Humayun Kabir; For this Inatitute, yes Sir.

Shri S. C. Samanta: May I know whether the shortage of equipment in the Mining Engineering department, and of staff also, will be considered by this Reviewing Committee?

Shri Humayun Kabir: I have said that the Reviewing Committee has already submitted its report.

Shri Ajit Singh Sarhadi; May I know if the question of opening a centre for examination at Ambala has been considered, in view of this being a leading Institute which must cater to the whole country?

Shri Humayun Kabir: This does not arise out of this question.

Shri Subodh Hansda: May I know whether the report of the Reviewing Committee will be laid on the Table of the House?

Shri Humayan Kasir: The report is at the present moment under the consideration of the governing body of the Institute, under the direction of the Visitor; and, till the Visitor has considered the report it is considered secret. When it has been considered by the Visitor and his orders secured I shall place it on the Table of the House.

Shri Achar: May I know if the Reviewing Committee has considered the question of admissions to the Institute and, if so, what are its recommendations?

Mr. Speaker: He is asking about the details of the report. It will be placed an the Table of the House.

Shel Viswanatha Reddy: What were the defects noticed in the working of this Institute which warranted the appointment of this Reviewing Committee?

Shri Humayun Kabir: There is no question of defects; we are very much estisfied with the working of the Institute. But under the Act, the Visitor may appoint from time to time persons to review the progress and the work of the Institute, and it is in terms of that that a Committee has been appointed.

Shri Josehim Alva: Is it not true that the reputation of this Institute to rather high but it is for bringing it into line with the best institutions in the world that this has been done?

Shoi Humayan Kahir: We consider it to be one of the best institutes in the world already.

Shri Ram Krishen Gupta: May I know whether this Committee will also examine the question of admissions?

Mr. Speaker: It has examined and submitted a report.

Shei Vaisayee: May I know if notice of Government's intention to call an enquiry was given to the Institute and its reactions obtained?

Shri Humayun Kabir: Of course. Air; it is in the terms of Act itself.

## Foreign Classics

Shri S. C. Samanta: Shri Subodh Hansda: Shri D. C. Sharma:

Will the Minister of Education be sinased to refer to the reply given to Starred Question No. 455 on the 2nd December, 1958 and state:

- (a) whether the manuscripts of foreign classics and Biology series have been selected for publication;
- (b) whether individual authors can approach the Central Government for such assistance as is generally offered to publishers; and
- (c) the languages in which the submitted manuscripts have been written?

The Minister of Education (Dr. K. L. Shrimali): (a) The Scheme has been dropped.

(b) and (c). Do not arise.

Shri S. C. Semanta: May I know whether the UNESCO proposal award ten prizes to Indian authors for the best book for the new reading public has been implemented?

Dr. K. L. Skrimall: This is a different question. As far as I remember, I think a press notification has been issued, but I cannot say at what stage the proposal is. It is entirely a different matter.

Shri Subodh Hansda: What is the reason for dropping this proposal?

Dr. K. L. Shrimali: While the Ministry was negotiating with the publishers the publishers independently brought out the books, and they were of quite good quality. Therefore, the proposal to give subsidy to the publishers was dropped.
