advertisements of infant milk substitutes and feeding bottles and also prescribes measures to ensure that in the marketing of infant milk substitutes no impression is given that feeding of these products is equivalent to or better than breast-feeding. Contravention of the provisions of the Bill would attract penal action.

The Government is actively collaborating with the professional bodies such as the Indian Medical Association in promoting the concept of 'Baby Friendly Hospital' initiative mooted by UNICE and WHO. Government is actively involved in the National Task Force which will evolve procedures for recognizing Baby Friendly Hospitals in the country.

HIV-2 Virus

Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of persons screened, the number of ELISA positive cases and the number of confirmed cases of HIV infection based on Western blot test detected in the country during the last three years, statewise;
- (b) whether the screening test for HIV-1 virus does not always detect HIV-2 virus;
- (c) if so, whether the Government propose t make available the test kit for the detection HIV-2 virus in each AIDS detection cantre keeping in view the new menace created by this virus; and

(d) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRIM.L. FOTEDAR):
(a) to (d). The surveillance for HIV prevalence was taken up by ICMR from 1st October, 1985. This continued till November, 1990. Thereafter, the surveillance activity was taken over by the Directorate General of Health Services. The activities also expanded progressively over the years. Figures for ELISA positive cases are not separately compiled. The figures for the last 3 years i.e. 1990, 1991 & 1992 (upto the end of October, 1992) state-wise is as under:
