The Government has already reviewed the Shipping Policy with a view to promoting the interests of Indian Shipping Companies keeping in view the move towards globalisation and changes in economic polices. As part of the new Shipping Policy, a number of measures have been taken for the healthy growth of Indian Shipping Industry. These include:

- Automatic approval is now given for:
  - (i) Acquisition of all categories of ships, except crude tankers and OSVs, by Private Shipowning companies;
  - (ii) Sale of ships for further trading/ scrapping to a company within India or abroad;
