Education for Disabled Children

- *571. SHRI MAHESH KANODIA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Government are implementing the scheme named as Integrated Education for the Disabled Children:
- (b) if so, the targets fixed for the same for the year 1995-96; and
- (c) the achievements made so far under the Scheme since its implementation?
- THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA) : (a) Yes. Sir.
- (b) An additional coverage of about 5,000 disabled children is envisaged during 1995-96.
- (c) Approximately 40,000 disabled children have been covered under the scheme so far.

Free Rail Passes

- *572. SHRI HARISINH CHAVDA: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:
- (a) the categories of persons to whom free rail passes are issued;
- (b) the number of freedom fighters to whom free rail passes have been issued during 1994-95 till date and the class in which they are entitled to travel;

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C.K. JAFFER SHARIEF): (a) Presumably, the reference is to All India Complimentary Card Passes granted to Individuals/ Organisations. These Card Passes are granted by Ministry of Railways to eminent persons/organisations devoted to social, cultural, scientific, literary, sports and educational activities of All India character etc., and based on justification/merits of each case.

In addition, free complimentary card passes are issued to former Members of Parliament and to Freedom Fighters/their widows.

- (b) 36126 Complimentary Card passes were issued to Freedom Fighers in 1994-95 (March to February) and 4768 such passes in March 1995. These passes entitle the Freedom Figher to travel in First Class/AC Sleeper along with a companion.
 - (c) No, Sir.
 - (d) Does not arise.
- (e) The cost of card passes issued to Freedom fighers is borne by the Ministry of Home Affairs. The cost of complimentary card passes to individuals/ organisations is not computed.

Development of Coconut
