**Households with Piped Drinking Water Supply**

2610. DR. NISHIKANT DUBEY:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the percentage of households having piped drinking water supply, State/ UT-wise including Jharkhand especially in Santhal Pargana; and
- (b) the percentage of households using other sources of water for drinking purpose, State/UT-wise?

**ANSWER**

(a) & (b) Since August, 2019, to make provision of potable tap water supply to every rural household of the country, including those in Santhal Pargana of Jharkhand, by 2024, Government of India in partnership with States is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM).

At the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission, 3.23 Crore (17%) households were reported to have tap water connections. So far, around 7.54 Crore (38%) rural households have been provided with tap water connections. Thus, as on 20.12.2022, out of 19.36 Crore rural households in the country, around 10.77 Crore (55.62%) households are reported to have tap water supply in their homes. Apart from the households that have tap water connection in their homes, 43.72% rural households are covered through drinking water source at reasonable distance. State/ UT-wise details are **annexed**.

Further, as reported, out of 15.37 lakh rural households in Santhal Pargana area of Jharkhand which comprises 6 districts, as on 20.12.2022, 3.26 lakh (21%) households are getting potable water through tap connections.
