PROMOTION OF AYUSH SYSTEM

Will the Minister of **AYUSH** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government proposes to create awareness for overall development and promotion of AYUSH system of medicines;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise;
- (c) the details of funds allocated and utilised in the promotion of AYUSH, State/UT-wise and district-wise;
- (d) whether the Government provides financial assistance for construction of buildings for setting up of new AYUSH dispensaries and 50 bedded integrated AYUSH Hospitals under the National AYUSH Mission; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

**ANSWER

(a) to (c):

Ministry of Ayush has developed various Central Sector Schemes and a Centrally Sponsored Scheme for overall development and promotion of Ayush system of medicines including awareness, as given below:

Central Sector Schemes:-

- i. Champion Services Sector Scheme for Medical Value Travel
- ii. Ayush Oushadhi Gunvatta Evam Utpadan Samvardhan Yojana (AOGUSY) Scheme
- iii. Ayurwashthya Yojana
- iv. Ayurgyan Scheme
- v. Central Sector Scheme for Promotion of International Co-operation in Ayush
- vi. Central Sector Scheme for Promotion of Information, Education and Communication (IEC) in Ayush
- vii. Central Sector Scheme for Conservation, Development and Sustainable Management of Medicinal Plants

Information with respect to State/UT-wise is not maintained under the Central Sector Schemes

Centrally sponsored Scheme:-National Ayush Mission

Ministry of Ayush is implementing Centrally Sponsored Scheme of National Ayush Mission (NAM) through States/UTs for the development and promotion of Ayush system including awareness. The National Ayush Mission (NAM) *inter-alia* makes provision for the following activities: -

- (i) Ayush Health & Wellness Centres
- (ii) Co-location of Ayush facilities at PHCs, CHCs and DHs
- (iii) Upgradation of existing standalone Government Ayush Hospitals
- (iv) Upgradation of existing Government/Panchayat/Government aided Ayush Dispensaries/Construction of building for existing Ayush Dispensary (Rented/dilapidated accommodation)/Construction of building to establish new Ayush Dispensary
- (v) Setting up of upto 10/30/50 bedded integrated Ayush Hospitals
- (vi) Supply of essential drugs/consumables to Government Ayush Hospitals, Government Dispensaries and Government/Government aided Teaching Institutional Ayush Hospitals
- (vii) Ayush Public Health Programmes
- (viii) Behaviour Change Communication (BCC)
- (ix) Mobility support at State and District level
- (x) Ayush Gram
- (xi) Establishment of new Ayush colleges in the States where availability of Ayush teaching institutions is inadequate in Government Sector
- (xii) Infrastructural development of Ayush Under-Graduate Institutions
- (xiii) Infrastructural development of Ayush Post-Graduate Institutions/ add on PG/ Pharmacy/Para-Medical Courses

Under National Ayush Mission (NAM), Grant-in-aid is being provided to States / UTs as per the proposals received in their State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs). Consolidated amount of Rs. 3119.47 crore has been released to the State /UT Governments for the promotion of Ayush system of medicines from the year 2014-15 to 2021-22 as per the proposal received from State Government through SAAPs. Under National Ayush Mission (NAM) there is no provision for district wise release. State/UT wise status of released grant is enclosed as **Annexure I**.

(d) & (e):

Public Health is a state subject and implementation of setting up of new Ayush dispensaries and 50 bedded integrated Ayush Hospitals comes under the purview of respective State / UT Government. As per National Ayush Mission guidelines, there are provisions of financial assistance of Rs 30.00 lakhs for construction of new Ayush dispensaries and Rs 1500.00 lakhs for construction of 50 bedded integrated Ayush Hospitals. The State/UT Governments may avail financial assistance by submitting suitable proposals through State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) as per National Ayush Mission guidelines.
