Garhwal distict, a similar plant of 2.0 KW capacity has been installed at Auli in Chamouli District. The Central Government assistance in the form of photovoltaic modules for these plants amount to about Rs. 10.3. lakhs. The State Government has proposed the installation of two more plants in Pauri and one more plant in Chamouli.
