Will the Minister of SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT be pleased to state:-

whether it is a fact that only about 50-70 students from Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs) and landless agricultural labour families which have been granted final National Overseas Scholarship (NOS) award letters under the National Overseas Scholarship schemes against the set target of 100 such students during the last six years and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT (SUSHRI PRATIMA BHOUMIK)

No, Sir. The Department of Social Justice & Empowerment implements the National Overseas Scholarship Scheme for students from Scheduled Castes, Denotified Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic Tribes, Landless Agricultural Labourers and Traditional Artisans to pursue Masters' or Ph.D courses by studying abroad. Similarly, Ministry of Tribal Affairs implements NOS Scheme for students belonging to ST community.
