- (9) The Secretary to Government, Public Works Department.
- (10) The Secretary to Government, Agriculture and Forests Department.

(c) Preliminary survey of the project areas is in progress and this is expected to be completed by 15th July 1952. Actual work on the project areas will commence early in October, 1952 in time for the *rabi* season. The work on Community Projects, as at present envisaged, is a three year programme beginning this year with a view to completion within three years.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS IN DRY AREAS

*1093. Shri Chinaria: Will the Minister of Planning and River Valley Schemes be pleased to state how many of the Community Projects have been located in unirrigated areas, having low average annual rainfall?

The Minister of Finance (Shri C. D. Deshmukh): None of the areas selected for the Community Projects is completely unirrigated. The following areas have an average annual rainfall of 20" or less, but are reported to have existing irrigation facilities or possibilities of development of irrigation.—

FOREIGN EMPLOYEES IN INDIAN EMBASSIES

225. Prof. Agarwal: Will the **Prime** Minister be pleased to state:

(a) how many foreign employees nationality-wise, are still working in our Embassies abroad;

(b) whether there is any scheme of replacing them gradually by Indian officers; and

(c) how many Indian employees in our Embassies have a working knowledge of Hindi?

The Prime Minister (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): (a) and (c). Information is being collected and a statement will be laid on the Table of the House as soon as the details are available.

(b) There are general orders that as far as possible recruitment should be restricted to Indians. In accordance with these orders and as part of the basic principles on which the Indian Foreign Service has been formed, non-Indians are being retained or employed in our Missions and posts abroad, in subordinate capacities, only where administrative and financial considerations render it absolutely necessary. The Indian Foreign Service itself is manned entirely by Indians.

226. Prof. Agarwal: Will the Minister of **Planning and River Valley Schemes** be pleased to state the decision of the recent Inter-State Conference on the Damodar Valley Corporation?

The Minister of Finance (Shri C. D. Deshmukh): The conference approved of the estimates of the Maithon Project. It was decided that the height of the Maithon Dam shall be at R.L. 500. As regards Panchet Hill Dam. the Damodar Valley Corporation were asked to prepare a detailed estimate within two months and obtain the approval of the participating Governments. The Corporation were also asked to keep the participating Governments informed of any increase in the cost of estimates from time to time and to send a monthly statement showing the cost accounts to the technical representatives of the participating Governments.
