The Minister of Food and Agriculture (Shri Kidwai): (a) The extended cost of sinking a standard tubewell of 200 ft depth under the Indo-U.S. Agreement including the cost of pumping installation and the supply of transformer costing about Rs. 1.600 is Rs. 29,000. The actual cost will, howover, depend on the depth of the tubewell

(b) Pumping set and distribution transformers can be of indigenous manufacture. The estimated costs of these two items of indigenous manufacture are Rs. 5,700 and Rs. 2,000 respectively.
