AMBULANCE VANS FOR COLLIERY WORKERS IN MADHYA PRADESH

Shah: (a) Will the Minister of Labour be pleased to state whether Government are aware of the fact that the two Ambulance Vans supplied on Labour Welfare Account, for carrying the patients to Hospitals, to the District Chhindwara Coal Mines in Madhya Pradesh, have gone off the road since last one year?
