The Minister of State in the Ministry of Home Affairs (Shri Datar): (a) In the first three months of 1962 there were 23 car thefts as against 18 in the last three months of 1961.

Stolen cars, have, however, been recovered in all the 54 true cases.

The Minister of Finance (Shri Morarji Desai): (a) and (b). The recent cut in the British bank rate is not likely to affect the Indian economy to any significant extent.

Central Office of Life Insurance Corporation

The Minister of Finance (Shri Morarji Desai): (a) to (d). The Estimates Committee, 1960-61 in their 134th Report (2nd Lok Sabha) recommended that the Central Office of the Life Insurance Corporation may be shifted to a more central place. Government's reply to this recommendation has already been sent to that Committee. Presumably this matter is still under that Committee's consideration.

Promotion of Telugu Drama

83. Shri E. Madhusudan Rao: Will the Minister of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Sangeet Natak Akadami has given any grants for the promotion of Telugu drama in Andhra Pradesh during 1959-60, 1960-61 and 1961-62; and

(b) if so, the amount allocated for each year?

The Minister of Scientific Research and Cultural Affairs (Shri Humayun Kabir): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) 1959-60: Rs. 2,000.00

1960-61: Rs. 9,000.00 (out of which Rs. 7,000.00 was sanctioned to the Andhra Pradesh Sangeet Natak Akadami for its general activities which include music and dance besides drama).

1961-62: Rs. 4,000.00.
