

Here also, space was given free of charge. The nominal cost involved in the decoration of this stall came to \$78 (Rs. 366|- approximately). The booth was manned by a member of the Tourist Office who visited Long Beach in the course of his tour.

Toronto:

5. Canadian National Exhibition held at Toronto (August-September 1964): Space was made available free by M/s. Lufthansa and the display was put up by the Govt. of India Tourist Office, Toronto with the help of display material available with the office. Therefore, no expenditure was incurred.

Paris:

6. Paris Fair (May 1964): This is a very big international exhibition held every year in Paris where the Tourist Office participated for the first time in 1964. Space was donated free by the Fair authorities and the expenditure on putting up a suitable display came to French Francs 320 (Rs. 310|-approximately).

(ii) The Department and/or its overseas offices participate in a number of international exhibitions/fairs as part of the participation organized by the Ministry of Commerce. Tourist literature|photographs|transparencies etc., are displayed at these exhibitions in order to put up a small corner on "Tourism in India". Sometimes, the literature and photographs etc., are sent to the Ministry of Commerce directly in Delhi by the Department. In most cases, however, when exhibitions are held in places which are closer to the tourist offices overseas than to India, the literature is made available by the nearest Govt. of India Tourist Office. Such exhibitions are listed below:—

(4) Ideal Home Exhibition held in London.
