Export Potential Industries

3413. Shri Ram Rishan Gupta: Will the Minister of Industrial Development and Company Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that many export-potential Industries are not utilising their capacity to produce fully; and
- (b) if so, the steps taken to give assistance to such industries?

The Minister of Industrial Development and Company Affairs (Shri F. A. Ahmed): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Export potential industries are given incentives in the form of cash subsidies. Those of the industries which fall in the list of Priority industries are given raw materials to their full requirements. Others earn import entitlements as per the current Import Trade Control Policy. These entitlements vary from 5 per cent to 50 per cent of the export depending on the industries.

Export of Iron Ore

- (a) the steps taken to increase the sale of iron ore in foreign countries;

Import of Chemicals by S.T.C.

3415. Shri Madhu Limaye: Shri G. M. Banerjee: Shri George Fernandes: Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia:

Will the Minister of Commerce be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the S.T.C. is importing at present/or was importing recently boric, borace acetic acids and other related chemicals;
- (b) whether India has become self-sufficient in this respect;
- (c) the foreign exchange spent on this during the last three years;
- (d) the reasons for not discontinuing imports; and
- (e) whether Government have considered the feasibility of requisitioning part of the indigenous production at prices to be fixed by Government and then selling it whenever prices rose beyond the controlled price?

The Minister of Commerce (Shri Dinesh Singh): (a) No. Sir.

- (b) While the capacity licensed for Borax and Boric acid would be sufficient to meet internal demands, the country has generally attained self-sufficiency in respect of Aostic acid excepting for negligible quantities of acid not conforming to special specifications.
- (c) and (d). Foreign Exchange has to be provided for import of rew materials like Resorite, Colemanite

and spare parts essentially needed for manufacture of Borag and Borie selfs: Like-wise foreign exchange has to be provided for the import of negligible quantities of Acetic Acid not conforming to special specifications. Details about the foreign exchange released for the above purposes are given below:

Acetic Acid

1963-64 Rs. 5'41 lakhs 1964-65 Rs. 1'11 lakhs 1965-66 Rs. 1'51 lakhs

Borax and Boric acid

1964—65 Rs. 19·68 lakhs 1965—66 Rs. 8·00 lakhs 1966—67 Rs. 59·146 lakhs

As per the present policy import of Acetic Acid, Boric acid and Borax is banned.
