High Yielding Varieties Programme in Orissa

The Minister of State in the Ministry of Food, Agriculture, Community Development and Cooperation (Shri Annasahib Shinde): The area proposed to be covered with the high yielding varieties of paddy, maize and jowar in Orissa during 1967-68 will be approximately 3,83,100 acres, as indicated below:
