During the Fourth Five Year Plan it is tentatively proposed to introduce 8000 small mechanised boats in addition to the existing fleet of over 5000 boats, at an estimated cost of Rs. 38.40 crores which includes provision for schemes relating to supply of Fishery requisites of items like synthetic fishing twine, hemp twine, manila ropes, sail cloth, floats, navigational aids fish finding equipments. salt etc.

For the exploitation of the off-shore fishing grounds it has been proposed to introduce 200 medium and large boats for which a tentative provision of Rs. 13.65 crores has been made in the current plan.

Very little information is available on the location and extent of fishing grounds in due deep sea region. These areas have to be properly explored and charted before commercial fishing can be taken up. For this purpose, a Deep Sea Fishing Station has been established and this station and its sub-stations have already carried out extensive surveys in the inshore and off-shore waters upto the 40 fathom line. This survey is now to be extended to the distant deep water regions, for which larger vessels will be required and a provision of Rs. 6.35 crores has been made in the Fourth Five Year Plan.

A problem closely connected with the mechanisation programme is the development of minor ports and provision of landing and berthing facilities at major ports. About 30 minor fishing ports will be developed. Survey reports have already been prepared for the location of fisheries establishments in the major harbours. A provision of Rs. 17 crores has been made for this scheme.
