(g) The Government of India had set up a National Advisory Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Yash Pal, former Chairman, University Grants Commission to advise on the ways and means to reduce academic burden on school students. In the 50th meeting of the Central Advisory Board on Education (CABE) held on 2.3.94, State Governments expressed their broad agreement with the recommendations of the Yash Pal Committee. The consensus of such views was identified and the course of action to be adopted by the State Governments suggested to them.

Development of National Highways in Maharashtra

THE MINISTER OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI T.G. VENKATRAMAN): (a) and (b) Four laning and strengthening of existing two lane road in Manor—Bassein Creek section (length 58 km.) of NH 8 in Maharashtra is included in Second National Highway Project under World Bank loan assistance. The estimated cost of the project is about Rs. 217 crore. No financial assistance has been

received from Asian Development Bank for developing National Highways in Maharashtra.

Hotels for Middle Class

792. SHRI RAM TAHAL CHAUDHARY: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government are unable to construct hotels for middle class due to the non-availability of land;

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI SRIKANTA JENA):
(a) to (c) Construction of hotels is primarily a private sector activity. In order to encourage construction of such accommodation, the Government of India provides incentives like interest subsidy which is available to one, two and three star hotels on loans taken from specified financial institutions, reduced duty on import of project equipment/capital goods and raw materials etc. The Government also offers exemptions under Income Tax Act.
