Indian Delegation's visit to Hungary regarding trade in Yarn and Cloth

- 67. S. P. BHATTACHARYYA: Will the Minister of FOREIGN TRADE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether an Indian delegation visited Hungary to explore prospects of exporting yarn and cloth to that country;
- (b) if so, the personnel of the delegation and the places visited by them; and
 - (c) the main findings of the delegation?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE (SHRI In the A. C. GEORGE): (a) to (c). response to the interest Hungarian Government in industrial collaboration whereby cotton would be supplied to India for conversion into textiles to be shipped back to Hungary, an Industrial Delegation led by Sh. B. D. Kumar, Jt. Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Trade and Shri S. Viswanath, Director General, Cotton Textile Export Promotion Council and Shri M.P. Gajaria, Asstt. Secretary, ICMF visited Budapest in the last week of January, 1972.

An understanding has been reached between Cotton Textile Export Promotion Council and the Hungarotex, Budapest on the following lines :-

- I. Hungarotex, would be prepared to take cotton textiles against supply of cotton to India and pay conversion charges. The Council is now to offer the quantities of textiles to the required specifications. Thereafter further negotiations would take place.
- 2. Arrangements might be evolved for supply of grey textile from India to Hungary which will market them in third countries after 'finishing', the foreign exchange realisations being suitably shared between the two countries. This arrangement could be implemented on an experimental basis and depending upon on its success, regular arrangements could be negotiated. Details proposal will be supplied bo of the Hungarotex.
- 3. Business transactions on appropriate lines could be enlarged to import of

Hungarian wool or synthetic fibre and varn and export of Indian tyre-cord yarn, woollen piece goods and knit wear.

Follow up action in this respect is in progress.
