- (b) The Indo-US Satellite TV experiment envisages installation of TV sets in 5000 villages in different parts of the country. This is only an experiment and a very small fraction of rural population in the country will get television viewing facilities during the experiment.
- (c) Reception from the satellite will be confined to specially designed sets which will be installed in these 5000 villages at Government expense. Reception from the satellite will not be possible on ordinary domestic sets.

Setting up of Cigarette factory in Tamil Nadu in joint sector

- 321. SHRI K. GOPAI: Will the Minister of INDUSTRIAL DEVELOP-MENT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government of Tamil Nadu propose to start a cigarette factory in Tamil Nadu in the joint sector; and
- (b) if so, the salient features of the proposal?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOP-MENT (SHRI SIDDHESHWAR PRASAD) (a) and (b). A Letter of Intent was issued to the Tamil Nadu Industrial Development Corporation Ltd. for setting up of a cigarette factory in Dharanpuri Distit of Tamil Nadu with a capacity of 4500 million Nos. per annum. No formal proposal for s arting the factory in the ioint sector has been received from the Corporation.

Foreign Exchange Racket Unearthed in Hyderabad

- 322. SHRI VARKEY GEORGE. Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:
- (a) whether a foreign exchange racket was unearthed in Hyderabad in September, 1971 and 12 people including some prominent missionaries were arrested; and
- (b) if so, whether any interrogations have been made in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL (SHRI RAM NIWAS MIRDHA): (a) The Directorate of Enforcement are enquiring into alleged violations of Foreign Exchange

Regulation Act which has come to notice by a seizure of some foreign exchange in August, 1971. During the course of enquiry, 15 persons have been arrested in the months of September and October, 1971 at Hyderabad. Three of them are reported to be connected with Missionaries.

(b) Since the investigation is in progress, it will not be desirable to disclose further details as it may hamper investigation.

- 323. SHRI VARKEY GEORGE: Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Planning Commission has approved the Annual Plans of the States for 1971-72; and
