# Leading of More Goods in Wagons

## 2123. SHRI C. K. CHANDRAPPAN: SHRI R. K. SINHA:

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Railway Vigilance Organisation has detected some cases of malpractices being adopted by certain firms in loading more goods than required in the wagons;
- (b) if so, the number of persons arrested in this connection; and
- (c) whether some railway employees were also found involved in this act of cheating the Railways; and if so, the action taken against them?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a)

#### Investment in Fertiliser Production

2125. SHRI RAJDEO SINGH: Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

- (b) whether more production capacity will be created by extension of existing and setting up of new fertilisers plants; and
- (c) the broad features of the yearly plan for spending?

THE MINISTER OF CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI P. C. SETHI). (a) The investment in the public sector fertilizer plants during 1976-77 would be about Rs. 420 crores.

(b) A large scale programme is on hand for augmenting indigenous capacity for the manufacture of fertilizer in the Public, Private and Co-operative sectors. With the completion of this programme, the capacity is expected to increase to 65 lakh tonnes of nitrogen and 17 lakh tonnes of PrO.
