Promotion Policy of Punjab National Bank

6440. SHRI C. K. CHANDRAP-PAN: Will the Minister of FINANCE AND REVENUE AND BANKING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the management of the Punjab National Bank has terminated, unilaterally the promotion policy settlement which was formulated in 1973 regarding the promotion of clerks and special assistants as officer;
- (b) if so, the reasons for it and the details of the case;
- (c) whether the management declared a unilteral promotion policy rule through their Personnel Division Circular No. 232 dated 21st April, 1976 and arbitrarily enforced it under the course of "Emergency"
 - (d) if so, the facts thereof; and
- (e) whether Government now propose to take steps to revise it and arrive at a negotiated settlement with the representative trade union of the employees?

THE MINISTER OF AND REVENUE AND REVENUE AND BANKING (SHRI H. M. PATEL): (a) and (b). Punjab National Bank has reported that the Settlement dated 16th June, 1973, arrived at between the Bank and the All-India Punjab National Bank Employees' Federation regarding policy and procedure concering promotion of clerks and Special Assistants as officers, etc., was effective from 1st April, 1973 for a period of three years and shall continue to be binding even thereafter until cither party gives to the other two months' notice in writing of intention to terminate the Settlement. The Bank thas reported that the Settlement was because of certain anamolies/ difficulties in its implementation. The Employees' Federation, has objected to the termination of the Settlement as illegal and has taken up the matter with the Central Industrial Relations Machinery.

(c) to (c). The revised promotion policy was evolved by the Bank offer getting it approved from the Board of Directors of the Bank. The revised policy, according to the Bank, is an improvement over the previous Settlements since it will give chance to a larger number of employees to compete for posts which may fall vacant from time to time and generally promote the efficient working of the bank.

The bank has reported that it has set up a Committee consisting of three representatiwes of the management and three representatives of the Federation to discuss and review the promotion policy. The Committee has already held three meetings and is continuing by efforts to resolve the matter.

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE AND REVENUE AND BANKING (SHRI H. M. PATEL: (a) and (b). State Bank of India has reported that in response to the then Prime Minister's call to work harder and save more, it was decided by it to pay tribute to her on her birthday by undertaking a constructive programme during the week ended 19th November, 1976, throughout the State Bank Group. The programme included opening of savings accounts of children/students, granting loans to weaker sections of society, planting saplings, organising blood donation camps, display of boards reading 'Hamnar Bank State Bank' on establishments financed by the Bank, opening of new offices, adoption of villages and slums. There were no other celebrations of the birthday and the expenditure, if any, incurred was incidental to the implementation of the programme indicated.

- (c) No amount was spent in celebrating the birthday as such at the Bankura Branch of State Bank of India. However, it incurred an expenditure of Rs. 6,3 93.65 incidental to the programmes indicated above.
- (d) State Bank of India has reported that Managers of all branches in the State Bank Group were instructed to open a minimum of 59 savings accounts of children/students and grant a minimum of 59 loans to members of weaker sections of the society during the week 13th to 19th November, 1976.

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE AND REVENUE AND BANKING (SHRI H. M. PATEL): (a) and (b). State Bank of India has reported that as at the end of September 1976, its Bankura Branch had advanced Ra. 11-13 lacs to the following categories of borrowers:
