- (a) whether the Government propose to renovate and modernise old power stations in the country in order to augment powergeneration capacity; and
- (b) if so, the amount proposed to be spent and the details of power stations to be taken up for renovation in different states?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF POWER AND NON-CON-VENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES (SHRI KALP NATH RAI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The total estimated cost for Renovation and Modernisation (R&M) Programme (Phase-I and II scheme) is Rs. 1222.88 crores and Rs. 1260.06 crores covering 34 and 46 old thermal power stations, respectively. Details of these stations, in different states, are given in Statements-I and II attached. In so far as Hydro Power Stations are concerned, the estimated cost of R&M works of 66 stations is Rs. 1171 crores. Details of Hydro station proposed for R&M in different states are given in the enclosed Statement-III.
