World Bank Assistance for Narmada Sagar Dam Project

- (b) if so, the reasons for the delay in getting the assistance?

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI VIDYACHARAN SHUKLA): (a) Yes, Sir,

- (b) Narmada Sagar Project was initially appraised by the World Bank in 1984-85. However, the World Bank subsequently informed that re-appraisal of the project would be necessary in view of, inter-alia, the World Bank's new operational directives on environmental assessment requirements. The World Bank also indicated that to consider reinstatement of the project into its lending programme, Government of Madhya Pradesh would have to provide
- (i) A realistic financial plan;
- (ii) An environmental impact assessment; and
