THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI ARJUN SINGH): (a) and (b). On the basis of

surveys carried out by the Botanical Survey, of India (BSI), more than 400 species of orchids, including 25 endemic, ones, have so far been recorded in Arunachal Pradesh. Details of orchid species which are rare and/or vulnerable to extinction are given in the Statement attached.

- (c) and (d). Export of orchids of wild origin is not permitted from any part of the country. According to the provisions of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), the export of three species of orchids, viz. Blue Vanda (Vanda coerulea) Ladies Slipper (Paphiopedilumspp) and Red Vanda (Ranatera imschootiana) is prohibited. These three species of orchids have also been brought under the purview of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, in order to control their exploitation from the wild. The export of the remaining species covered under the CITES is strictly regulated.
- (e) The BSI maintains about 3000 live plants belonging to 400 orchid species in there orchidaria. The Government of Arunachal Pradesh also maintains a large collection of live orchids in its research Station at Tipi in Kameng District.

A large number of National Parks., Sanctuaries and Biosphere Reserves have been set up in various States which preserve both the fauna and the flora including orchids; and some of these protected areas give particular attention to the endangered species of orchids.
