water pumping windmills as well as solar water pumps have been received this year from several State nodal agencies including the Tamil Nadu Energy Development Agency. The programme is being restructured to incorporate improved models and wider range of pump capacities. Allocations to different states will be made thereafter taking into account the availability of resources.

Central Assistance to Rajasthan

- 3710. SHRIMATI VASUNDHARA RAJE: Will the Minister of PLANNING AND PROGRA. MME IMPLEMENTATION be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Government of Rajasthan has requested the Planning Commission to step up the Central assistance for 1992-93 to bring it at par with the increase allowed to other non-special category States; and
- (b) if so, the reaction of the Planning Commission thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION AND MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF NON-CONVENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES (SHRISUKH RAM): (a) and (b). Yes, Sir, Some States (including Rajasthan) have requested the Planning Commission to step up the Central assistance. The allocation of Central Assistance for States' Plan for 1992-93 was made under the revised formula approved by the National Development Council in December, 1991. Therefor, stepup in the Central assistance to any State may be difficult. However, keeping in view the special problems of the State, an additional assistance of Rs. 10 crores was allocated to Rajasthan State for Indira Gandhi Canal Project, in addition to Rs. 52 crores provided for this project under Border Area

Development Programme during 1992-93.

Government Job to Landless People

3712. SHRIR. JEEVARATHINAM: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (DEPARTMENT OF RURAL DEVELOP-MENT): (SHRIUTTAMBHAIH. PATEL): (a) to (c). Integrated Rural Development Programme (IRDP) and Jawahar Rozgar · Yojana (JRY) are two schemes through which

employment opportunities are created in rural areas. The objective of IRDP is to provide self-employment opportunities to the rural people below the poverty line through Government subsidy and bank credit. Landless agricultural labourers are an important segment of the target group under this Programme. In 1991-92, out of 25 lakh families assisted under IRDP, about 9 lakh families were landless agricultrual labourers. JRY aims at creating wage employment opportunities for unemployed and underemployed persons below the poverty line in the rural areas. Unemployed landless labourers are included in the target group of JRY.
