

Regarding upgradation and development of Railway Health Care Unit at Kollam-laid

SHRI N. K. PREMACHANDRAN (KOLLAM): Railway Health Care Unit at Kollam is housed in a 100-year-old tiled building without any periodical renovations. The average number of patients in the hospital exceed 200 per day including pensioners, family pensioners and travelling public. But the facilities in Health Care Unit are not sufficient to meet the requirement. Upgrading the Health Care Unit at Kollam to a Sub Divisional Hospital with all lab facilities and radio diagnosis facilities such as CT scan, MRI Scan are essential for rendering service to the patients. The major project for redevelopment of Kollam Railway Station is progressing. But the development of Health Care Unit at Kollam seems to be totally ignored in the project. Therefore, I urge upon the Government to include the upgradation and development of Health Care Unit at Kollam in the re-development project.
