

Need to provide financial assistance to farmers in Telangana affected due to floods

SHRI MANNE SRINIVAS REDDY (MAHBUBNAGAR): In the recent occurrence of rains and floods in Telangana State, around 41 people have died due to heavy rains resulting in floods and led to flooding of low-lying areas and damaged agricultural fields at several places in the State. Our State authorities on a war-footing basis are working tirelessly, day in and day out to help individuals affected by these floods, in addition to provision of access to clean water, sanitation, medicine and hygienic staying conditions to restore normally. Due to non-interlinking of rivers in the country and with excess water in river Godavari, flash floods in northern districts like Khammam, Adilabad, Warangal have inundated thousands of villages, disrupting electricity connections and traffic and property worth thousands of crores of rupees had been damaged due to incessant rains and floods and approximately Rs. 5,000 crore loss was estimated. Lakhs of acres of crops were damaged completely. Around 1.5 crore farmers have faced financial loss due to floods. Government of Telangana demands that the Union Government must intervene in the matter by sending a Central team and provide financial assistance to the victims immediately.
