- (e) The targets of the remaining correspondence and other items of the programme will be the same as fixed in this Programme.

Targets for 1990-91 in respect of Central Government offices located in Region 'C'

- (a) Communications from Central Government Offices located in Region 'C' to Central Government Offices in Regions 'A' & 'B'—20%.

Rule 4(d) & (e)

- (b) Communications to State/ Union Territories and individuals in Regions 'A' & 'B'—60%.

- (c) Communications to Central Government Offices in Region 'C'—20%.

- (d) All communications received in Hindi must be replied to in Hindi. Rule 5

- (e) All applications, appeals or representations made or signed in Hindi should essentially be replied to in Hindi. Rule 7(2)

For Units of the Defence Ministry

- (a) Correspondence between the three headquarters and Ministries of Defence and other Ministries.—60%

- (b) Correspondence between the headquarters and army command headquarters and the entire correspondence between all the units of the army and the command offices—35%.

- (c) Correspondence between the headquarters of the Navy and the Air Force and their command offices and the entire correspondence between these forces and all the units and the command offices—30%

- (d) The above targets will be applicable to offices of three services where mainly armed forces officers and 'other ranks' are employed.

- (e) The targets of the remaining correspondence and other items of the programme will be the same as fixed in this programme.

Construction of Rajghat Dam Project

2190. SHRI VISHWANATH SHARMA: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

- (a) the present position of the construction of the inter-State Rajghat Dam Project;

- (b) the details of cost-escalation resulting from delay in setting up the project; and

- (c) the time by which it is likely to be completed?

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI VIDYACHARAN SHUKLA): (a) The works on earth dam and masonry dam have been completed to the extent of about 92% and 80% respectively. Other miscellaneous works have been completed to the extent of about 68%.

- (b) The project was originally (at 1979 price index) estimated to cost Rs. 123.22 crores. The estimated cost as revised in 1987 is Rs. 213.66 crores. The cost escalation is mainly due to rise in prices during construction period. The delay in completion of the project is mainly due to constraint of funds.

- (c) The dam is scheduled for completion in June, 1993.
