No profit to Railway after spending huge amount

4618. SHRI SUBHASH YADAV: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the reaction of the Ministry in reagard to the news item published in the daily newspaper "Jansatta" dated 13 May, 1985 under the caption "Do Arab Rupaya Laga Kar Bhi Railway Ko Munafa Nahin" (No profit to Railways even after spending two hundred crores of rupees);
- (b) whether it is a fact that Railways have not carned the required profit even after spending Rs. 192 crores on construction works and besides this a number of alarming irregularities regarding import purchase and storage have been found; and
- (c) if so, the reasons therefor and the action proposed to be taken by Government to check this trend in future and the action proposed to be taken by Government against the officers who are responsible for the loss suffered as a result of such investments?

THE MINISTER OF RAILWAYS (SHRI BANSI LAL): (a) The news item published in the daily "Jansatta" is based on the material contained in the Advance Report of Comptroller & Auditor General of India for 1983-84, presented to the Parliament. The Advance Report is under scrutiny of the Ministry of Railways and detailed remarks are being furnished to the Public Accounts' Committee through the Audit.

(b) & (c). According to the aforesaid Audit Report, the investment of over Rs. 197 crores, on various projects on different Railways, has not resulted in accrual of benefits, as expected. Some irregularities regarding import, purchase and storage have also then alleged. However, as per normal procedure in regard to points made in the Audit Report, necessary action is always taken in the light of the recommendations of the Public Accounts Committee.
