- (ii) Central Institute of Brackishwater Aquaculture (CIBA)
- (iii) National Research Centre on Coldwater Fisheries.

For the purpose, the areas of research were reallocated resulting in the transfer of brackishwater fishery research from Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute and the erstwhile Central Inland Fisheries Research Institute to CIBA. In the process, the erstwhile CIFRI has been reorganised as Central Inland Capture Fisheries Research Institute (CICFRI) with a mandate of research on riverine and lacustrine fisheries.

The major activities of the Central Inland Capture Fisheries Research Institute (CIC-FRI) are to study dynamics of exploitable fishery resources of rivers, lakes and reservoirs etc. and to evolve management norms. The N.R.C. on Coldwater Fisheries is to carry out basic/applied research on Coldwater Fisheries for the development of upland water areas of the country. The major activities of Central Institute of Freshwater Aquaculture are to conduct research in nutrition, physiology, genetics, pathology, pond environmental monitoring and aquaculture engineering, to develop advanced freshwater fish farming systems for commercial fin fish/shell fish. The Central Institute for Brackishwater Aquaculture is to conduct disciplinary mission oriented basic applied research to develop appropriate technologies of Brackishwater Aquaculture.

(c) and (d). Chief Minister of West Bengal and Minister of State Incharge Department of Fisheries, West Bengal, had drawn the attention of the then Union Minister for Agriculture towards the re-organisation of fisheries research and had expressed their-fears regarding reduction in fisheries research activities by ICAR in West Bengal. The Chief Minister and the Minister, Government of West Bengal were duly assured by the then Union Minister for Agriculture that there would be no reduction in fisheries research activities in West

Bengal as a result of this re-organisation. On the other hand, fisheries research activities by ICAR in West Bengal are being further strenghtened and streamlined.

Sheep and Wool Development in Karnataka

3208. SHRI H.B. PATIL: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COOPERATION IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA). (a) and (b). Government of Karnataka has prepared and submitted the project proposal for sheep development in 9 districts under World Bank Assistance in order to encourage sheep and wool development in the State. This project has been examined in this Ministry and State Government has been requested to make some modifications.

As part of its expansion, during the VII Plan a UNDP aided project for 'Establishment of a Centre for Digital Techniques in Broadcasting has been sanctioned. The project envisages building up of knowhow and expertise for enhanced induction of digital techniques in the broadcast networks. The total sanctioned outlay is \$348,150 (Rs. 42 lakhs) as UNDP input and Rs. 59.356 lakhs as Government of India input.
