bility of rice, edible oils, pulses, sugar and milk according to the provisionally available data works out as follows:

The number of calories derived from these items alone works out to approximately 1221 calories per capita per day.

(b) The number of calories required for a healthy person depends upon age, sex, weight and nature of work of the person. The Test Force on Minimum Needs and Effective Consumption Demand constituted by the Planning Commission (1979) adopted an average norm of 2400 calories per capita per day for rural areas and 2100 calories per capita per day for urban areas.
