THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS AND MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY HOME **AFFAIRS** (SHRI CHIDAMBARAM): (a) The total strength of para-military forces, namely Border Security Force, Central Reserve Police Force, Assam Rifles and Indo-Tibetan Border Police as on 1-12-81 and 1-12-87 was 182 241 Battalions and **Battalions** respectively. The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) which is not organised on battalion pattern had a sanctioned strength of 42,825 personnel as on 1-12-81. The strength of CISF and the National Security Guards (raised in 1984) as on 1-11-87 was 70, 577.

(b) Total expenditure incurred on all the above mentioned para-military forces for the period April-December, 1987 was Rs. 555.04 crores.

Voting Rights on N.R.Is.

5930. SHRI V.S. KRISHNA IYER: Will the Minister of LAW AND JUSTICE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware that the Indian nationals living abroad are denied franchise in the countries they lived:

right to participate in the elections in those countries in terms of the relevant laws applicable to such persons in those countries.
