Health Care Facilities Provide for Tribals

1673. SHRI MANIK REDDY: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the health care facilities are being provided specially by Union Government for the tribals in the tribal areas of the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARISAROJ KHAPARDE): (a) and (b). The Union Government with the help of the State Government is getting the following infrastructure created under the Minimum Needs Programme in the tribal areas:-

i) One Sub-centre for every 3000 population in tribal areas. The salaries of ANMs, cost of Medicines, the rental charges of Sub-Centres building etc. are borne from Family Welfare Programme budget;

ii) One Village Health Guide with simple

drugs for minor ailment for every 1000 population in tribal areas; and in addition, one trained Dai is provided for each 1000 population; and

iii) One Primary Health Centre in every 20000 population in tribal areas. The medical and para-medical personnel who are manning these infrastructure are being trained in different institutions and cost of such training is met by the Union Government. Further the Centrally Sponsored Schemes of Control of Communicable diseases etc. are being implemented by the States for benefit of the people of tribal areas in the country. The Central assistance is provided to the States as per approved pattern of assistance.

The Central Council for Research in Homeopathy have set up 22 Clinical Research Unites (T) in the different parts of the country. They provide incidental medical aid to the tribals at their door steps by visiting their villages. Similarly, the Central Council for Research in Ayurveda and Siddha have established 5 Tribal Health Care Research Projects in Ayurveda, 2 in Siddha, 1 in Amchi System of Medicine besides 2 Regional Research Centres. These projects while implementing their assigned programmes also extend incidental medical aid to the ailing subjects. In addition, medical aid to the tribal masses is being provided through OPD of the Centres of the Council functioning in tribal areas of Itanagar, Tadong (Sikkim) and Leh.

Increase in Steel Price of Different Varieties

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF STEEL IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA) (a) Yes, Sir. The

Joint Plant Committee has increased the average prices of iron by 16% and steel by about 15.6% with effect from 24.12.1987.

(b) The details of JPC base prices of steel (F.O.R. Railhead Station) prior to 24.12.1987 and after the increase with effect from 24.12.1987 are indicated in the statement.

(c) The increase in price which was due to increase in cost of inputs such as coal, power, fuel and railway freight was allowed on an average basis without specifically attributing the extent of increase against a particular cost escalation factor.

(d) The overall effect is likely to be negligible.
