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(b) if so, whether in such collaborations, provision is made for know how for establishing suitable auxiliary industries?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI J. VENGAL RAO): (a) Government pelicy regarding import of technology has been to bridge the technology gaps in the industrial sector. Import of technical know-how is permitted in sophisticated and high priority areas, in export oriented or import substitution manufacturing or for enabling indigenous industry to update existing technology in India to meet efficiently domestic requirements and/or to become competitive in the export market.

However there is a list of industries where no foreign collaboration, financial or technical, is considered normally necessary and requests for collaboration in this list are not normally considered.

(b) Foreign collaboration approvals are subject to a standard condition that the Indian company should be free to sublicence the technical know how/product design/engineering design under the agreement to another Indian party should it become necessary. The terms of such sublicensing will, however, be as mutually agreed to by a 1 the parties concerned including the fore ign collaborator and will be subject to the approval of Government.

Foreign Collaborations

- 5255. SHRI ANANDA PATHAK: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:
- (a) whether there have been any foreign collaborations in respect of Polyester Staple Fibre, Cement, Ceremic glazed tiles, Synthetic Yarn, Circuit Breakers, Wiper arms and blades for automobiles, Automotive tyre cappings, Wheel rims. Tie rod ends, Radiatoes, Automobile Air Conditioners, Two-wheeler seats, Saloon-car seats, Cushions for car seats and Automobile rear view mirrors; and
- (b) if so, the details of each of such collaborations?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI J. VENGAL RAO): (a) and (b). Government has approved 673, 752, 1024, 957 and 853 proposals for foreign collaboration during 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1987 respectively. The particulars of proposals approved foreign collaboration viz. name of Indian Company, foreign collaborator, items of manufacture, nature of collaboration are published on a monthly basis by the Indian Investment Centre as a supplement to its monthly News Letter. Copies of the publication are sent regularly to the Parliament Library.
