Intervention by Central Government in Strike of Maharashtra Government Employees

383. SHRI SAMAR MUKHERJEE: Will the Minister of PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS AND LABOUR be pleased to state:

(a) whether Central Government were approached by the employees of the Maharashtra Government for intervention in the strike that took place during December, 1977 and January, 1978 and settle their demands; and

(b) the steps taken by Government on their representation?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS AND LABOUR (SHRI RAVINDRA VARMA): (a) and (b) There was no such request to the Central Government, or the Central Industrial Relations Machinery. Nor could any action be taken under the Industrial Disputes Act in the case of strike by the Maharashtra State Government employees etc. The strike has since been called off.

Meeting of Chinese Ambassador with Foreign Minister

385. SHRI MOHINDRA SINGH SAYIN WALA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Chinese Ambassador met him and they discussed broadly the step by step progress of the process of normalisation of relations between the two countries; and

(b) if so, what new measures are sought to be adopted towards complete normalisation?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI ATAL BIHARI VAJ-PAYEE): (a) and (b) On 31st December 1977, the Chinese Ambassador met the Minister of External Affairs. In the course of discussions India's policy of seeking an improvement of relations with China on the basis of the Five Principles was spelt out by the Minister of External Affairs. There was broad agreement that both sides would encourage exchanges in various fields to the mutual benefit of both countries. A review of the on-going contacts in the fields of trad., culture, health, sports, etc., also took place and further possibilities of exchanges between India and China, on the principles of mutual benefit and reciprocity, were also explored.
