THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMEN-TARY AFFAIRS AND LABOUR (SHRI RAVINDRA VARMA) (a) to (e). No final decision has yet been taken on the question of repeal or revision of provision of pension to former Members of Parliament. This question was included as an item for discussion with the Leaders of Opposition Parties/Groups in both Houses of Parliament. A decision in the matter will be taken when the discussions conclude.

Opening of Regional Passport Office in each State

428. SHRI D. D. DESAI: SHRI RAM KANWAR BERWA:

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether his Ministry has taken a decision to have a passport office in each State capital;
- (b) if so, when the proposed regional passport offices will be opened in those State capitals which do not have one such office now; and
- (c) whether steps have also been taken to provide adequate staff to existing passport offices in view of the enormous increase in their work?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL (SHRI ATAL BIHARI AFFAIRS VAJPAYEE): (a) and (b). It is Government's objective to open passport offices in States which do not presently have one. To begin with, Passoprt Offices will be Regional opened in the States of Karnataka and Rajasthan early in the coming financial year. In order to provide a better service to the public in large States, where the volume of work does not warrant the opening of full-fledged Regional Passport Offices, ment proposes to open Sub-Regional Passport Offices. The details of these Offices are being worked out. It will be Government's endeavour to open as many Sub-Regional Passport Offices as possible during the coming financial year.
