(c) is there any proposal under consideration for off-shore exploration in the Bay of Bengal; and

(d) if not, the reasons thereof?

THE MINISTER OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS AND FERTILI-ZERS (SHRI H. N. BAHUGUNA): (a) During the period 1970-77 exploratory surveys and drilling operations in various parts of West Bengal were continued by the ONGC. In addition to putting in 2 party-years of geological field work, 27 partyyears of seismic and 3 party-years of gravity magnetic surveys, the ONGC conducted drilling operations on three structures, namely, Bakultala, Galsi and Diamond Harbour One well drilled each on Bakultala and Galsi structures did not indicate the presence of any oil or gas. A second well drilled on the Galsi structure is currently under production testing. Drilling of the first well at Diamond Harbour is also in progress.

(b) Besides exploring for deeper prospects, ONGC plans to continue seismic work in the Marshy Sundarban areas, and the Hinge zone areas of the Bengal basin.

(c) No, Sir. Not for the present.

(d) The data so far collected from geophysical surveys and off-shore drilling in the area are presently under analysis by the ONGC and future programme will depend upon the results of these studies.
