(c) what measures Government are taking to put down such profiteering?

INDIANS IN KENYA

787-L. Shri N. Sreekantan Nair: (a) Will the **Prime Minister** be pleased to state what is the total Indian population in Kenya?

(b) Have Government any information if any Indian residents in Kenya have been involved in the 'Mau Mau' movement and if so, how many have been arrested or shot?

The Prime Minister (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): (a) 90,528 according to the 1948 Census.

(b) So far as the Government of India are aware, Indians in Kenya are not involved in the 'Mau Mau' movement.

SINKIANG REFUGEES

787-M. Dr. Ram Subhag Singh: Wili the Prime Minister be pleased to state how many of the Sinkiang refugees who had come over to Kashmir have left for Turkey?

The Prime Minister (Shri Jawaharlal Nehru): A batch of 101 Sinkiang refugees migrated to Turkey for permanent settlement at the end of October 1952. Another batch of 85 refugees is due to leave Srinagar for Turkey on the 19th of December.
